Last Tuesday I got a great reminder about the importance of what Real Life does on campus.

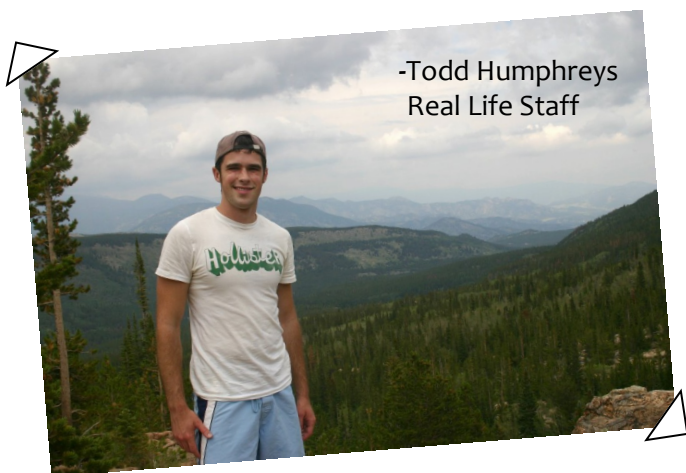
